S. No.	Suspected Drugs	Indications	Adverse Drug Reactions
1	Acetazolamide	As an adjunct in the treatment of chronic open-angle glaucoma; secondary glaucoma; as part of pre-operative treatment of acute-angle closure glaucoma.	Choroidal effusion or Choroidal detachment
2	Amlodipine	<ul style="list-style-type: none">To reduce fatal coronary heart disease, non-fatal myocardial infarction, risk of stroke and treatment of hypertension.To reduce the risk of coronary revascularization procedures and the need for hospitalization due to angina in patients with coronary artery diseases.	Lichenoid Keratosis
